Celebrations/Festivals and National events: -

Krishna Jayanti

On the occasion of Janmashtami the children of 1 to 5 took it upon themselves to celebrate the birth of Lord Krishna with performances and storytelling. The students welcomed with an introduction with Lord Krishna with a short dance & song. They were dressed like 'Natkath' and girls were beautifully 'Gopis'. During the Navratri festival (nine auspicious nights) prayers are offered to the Mother Goddess (Shakti). Students are dressed in traditional attire and dance to rhythmic tunes for the traditional 'Dandia' dance.

Diwali is popularly known as the "Festival of Lights", it is the most significant Indian festival that falls during the mid-year vacation (in the first half of November). While students are busy lighting up their homes, the staff at Chaitanya light up the campus with oil lamps and offer prayers to the Goddess of prosperity, for the welfare of all the students.

Childrens day
